The characters were strong and likable, and the plot was suspenseful, which really kept me reading. Given the premise for the title – genes and reproduction – there's a *lot* of sex in the book, though it's not explained in detail. That said, it's hard not to be amused by John and Liz's takes on the proclivities of their alien friends – or are they captors? The dénouement is dramatic and provides a very fitting end to a story whose ultimate resolution isn't particularly predictable.
